

Our vision is to be a growing church, rooted in Christ, that reaches out with love and service to the whole community.

Easter Day celebrations may be over, but the Easter season has only just begun. I hope that whatever your plans were, you were able to put by some time to reflect upon the Easter story, the life, death and resurrection of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Christ is risen. So, let us now begin our part in the work of Easter. To love as Jesus loved. To forgive as Jesus forgave. To give generously, as Jesus gave. And, to go and tell the world the good news of how he lived, died and rose again. So that others too can know his love, receive his forgiveness and be made new.

How do we do this? Here are a few tips: -

- Pray ask God to fill you with a desire to share the good news, to bring you opportunities to share the story of Easter and the courage to do it!
- Be clear about what you believe. That Jesus Christ was the Son of God, he died to take the punishment that we deserve for our sins and paid the price of sin which is death. Because of this we can have a relationship with God for eternity.
- Share your story in three short parts what was my life like before I knew Jesus, how did I come to trust and believe in Jesus and how has knowing God changed my life.
- Purchase a copy of a gospel to give away, or a helpful scripture verse, or a beginner's booklet on what it means to be a Christian.
- Keep praying for the person to come to know Christ.

A few years ago, the Archbishops of Canterbury and York started an initiative called 'Thy Kingdom Come'. At its centre is encouraging Christians to pray that God's Kingdom would come. Each year for 11 days between Ascension (30th May) and Pentecost (9th June), we are encouraged to pray for five people we know, to come to know, trust and believe in Jesus Christ.

It has grown to become a global ecumenical wave of prayer. The church will again be open for an hour each day with five prayer stations (see card and poster for times). We also hope that as many of you as possible will join us for morning prayer at 8am during this time!! Further information can be found on the website www.thykingdomcome.global/







